As you prepare for this special event, here are few reminders.

Leader's Guide Now Available

Get the answers to all your questions in the Jamboree *Leader's Guide*, available on the Jamboree web site. Please be sure to check back periodically for updates to the guide.

Day Passes Still Available

Discounted day passes (\$15/person) are still available for purchase online at the Jamboree web site until 6pm on April 9th. After the 9th, day passes may be purchased at the gate for the full price of \$20.

What to wear?

This is a uniformed event, so all Scouts and Scouters must be in full uniform.

Carpooling is a MUST

Parking is VERY limited at this event (because the normal fairgrounds parking lots are being used for camping) so plan accordingly and carpool! Day use parking is \$8 per car.

Don't forget your donation

Plan to bring a can of food or an extra \$1. All donations will go to the Alameda Community Food Bank.

Arrival

Campers and family campers (paid for overnight camping) upon arrival will enter through Gate 8.

To volunteer, go to the web site, click *Program Overview,* click on *Volunteer to help out,* put *PROGRAM VOLUNTEER* and specific activity in your comment line! You still need to be registered for a day pass or camping entry.

You will be guided to your camping site. Unload, move your car to off-site parking, set up your camping area, and send one representative to registration (North end of the fairgrounds grandstand, Building S) to pick up your registration packet. If that one representative is not the person who registered and paid online for the group, please send an authorization letter for the packet to be picked up.

The person who picks up the registration will be given all your materials (programs, wrist bands, etc) and others coming later will need to check-in with this person at your assigned site to get wrist bands to enter the Jamboree.
